The 2025 RFA- Jarrett Student Art Show & Visual Arts Scholarship is JUST around the corner.

We are excited to give two scholarships for \$2000 and \$750. The Show is our giveback to the community. We need many more volunteers than other shows.

Here's how to help make this the best show ever:

- Bring art and raffle donations to the RFA meeting on Thursday, March 20 (ideas below)
- Promotion - Pick up postcards and flyers at the meeting March 20. Hand out to all your personal contacts!
- Deliver to your favorite businesses!
- Comment on and share all the RFA Facebook and Instagram posts with your friends, family, neighbors.
- Pick up artwork from school offices – Rocklin, Colfax, Auburn, Foresthill, etc. on April 30 and return artwork the next week.
- Volunteer to be on the Student Show Jury Panel and the Scholarship Selection panel - There isn't a lot of time involved in the process and you get to make a difference in a young artist's life.
 - We are looking for a panel of 3-4 RFA members who will volunteer to judge the student artwork entries and work with the team to determine the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners in the grade level categories. You must be available to judge in person from 1:00-3:00pm on Friday, May 2, at Springview Hall. You will be provided with judging criteria and more information.
 - The Scholarship Selection Panel of 6-8 volunteers will review and score student's 1-page essays and images of their work. You must be available to judge in person from 1:00-3:00pm on Friday, May 2, at Springview Hall. You will be provided with the essays, judging criteria and more information.
- Volunteer to do a 1 or 2-hour demo or hands-on with student participation during the show on Saturday 12 – 4 pm or on Sunday 12 – 2 pm. Or bring the sketch crawl to the show and sketch during the show.
 - Must be a mess-free medium like mixed media, collage, pastel, colored pencil, watercolor pencil, etc. and give the students a chance to try out the medium you are demonstrating inside Springview Hall.
 - Must provide your own materials. You may limit your demo to 4 to 5 participants at a time.
 - NO SALES are permitted, but you may distribute your business cards, advertise classes and shows, and bring samples of your work so guests can see a finished product.
 - What we need from you: your name, medium you will be sharing and what students may do. This is for our online page. Email your info to rocklinfineart@gmail.com asap to book your spot!
- Sketch crawlers! We want to display your photos, sketches, paintings, or sketchbooks at the Student Show in our locked display case. Please bring on Thursday, April 17 to our Membership meeting, or to receiving on May 1.

About Kari ...

Most recently, Kari Uhlman has joined the Mills Station Arts and Cultural Center (MACC) and is preparing artwork to display there.

Her favorite medium is acrylic painting, however she recently won a Blick Portrait Oil Painting kit and has been trying oils. A trend she is interested in is water-based oil paints. She has purchased them, however hasn't tried them yet.

She knows when a piece is finished because her husband will tell her when it is.

The hardest part of creating a piece is making time to just practice her creativity.

Her days are very structured with occasional Rocklin Fine Arts Sketch Crawls, prayer, and walks with Bayside Church Granite Bay. She balances her time with Google calendar. All routine tasks, from taking out the compost to vacuuming are entered.

When she has trouble with a painting, she will ask her husband for feedback or watches a YouTube video. She has had no formal training.

She prepares for an exhibit by first perusing the artist call and checking her Google calendar to see if she has an existing piece that can be entered or if she will have time to create a new artwork by the deadline. She also needs to look for availability to deliver the art and attend the artist reception, if any.

She promotes her work on Rocklin Fine Arts website as well as UhltrawomanArt.com.

She is from Sacramento. She has an AA Degree in General Design however, her career was in civil service. Her first experience as a professional artist was at Zest Kitchen. She displayed her first painting of a boy with a hula hoop in Kenya. It sold!

She has been interested in art since she was a child. Her neighbor was an oil painter. Her biggest artistic influence is God. He is the Creator. We were made in His image therefore, she practices creativity as a form of worship.

Her life experience as an abuse survivor inspires her to paint vivid and peaceful pieces.

Her most valued skill as an artist is that she is teachable. She favors feedback as a gift.

Her favorite part of being an artist is when her artwork brings joy to others. The least favorite part of being an artist is not having enough time to just endlessly paint.

She believes networking with other artists is important because it has shown her how to look at art with different approaches. Some of her colleagues are very loose painters whereas others are experts at nailing down that hyper-realism she so adores.

Our April Member of the Month is ...

RFA President, Linda Hoschler

From Linda ...

Beginning as a child I was involved in all sorts of crafts in 4-H and dabbled in stained glass. It wasn't until watching glass blowing demonstrations all day long at the 1997 California State Fair that I truly decided collecting glass was not enough. I tried glass blowing which led me to fused glass. Stringers, noodles, powders, micas and paint are my favorite glass supplies. I like to experiment with inclusions - from copper sheet and copper wire to gold leaf; and flowers and leaves to ash; as well as reactions between the copper and sulfur ingredients of glass. I've been experimenting with gravity and weight to give dimension in glass. Look at one of my artworks and wonder what is in there?! You might call me a glass snob, as I truly believe you should be able to see through glass art. You can find transparent glass in all of my work as I like the way light can transmit and reflect colors, light, and layers with the glass. I hope viewers understand the work that goes into glass art and can 'feel' the difference between hand-made and factory mold production.

Fascinated by the interactions of color, intense heat, light, shape, texture, chemical reactions and inclusions my glass style is continually evolving as I innovate with glass art and the science of glass. I have enjoyed teaching children about the Science of Glass and encouraging future artists. My work is colorful, unique, and combines mixed media with glass art. Introduced to the ancient craft of Kumihimo, I like to combine unique pieces of opal looking glass jewelry with Kumihimo style beaded braids. I like making 'gem stones' out of glass, so far opals, onyx, slate and carnelian. A beginner at hand-building in clay, I incorporate ceramic figures with my glasswork, like pods of whales or sea lions on an ocean of glass. Ideas often come to me in my dreams!

I like to garden, read, make greeting cards and play with our chickens and koi. I also enjoy road trips, nature walks, and snapping photos—capturing shapes, shadows, patterns, nature, and feelings with my camera. These experiences end up being inspirational in my work. Teaching art and adventures at Camp Sacramento's Senior Camp has been rewarding in creating community, teaching art, and experiencing the art of nature. Although volunteering with RFA is my first priority, I also volunteer with the Art League of Lincoln on the social media team and the Gift Shop team and I'm an Advisory Committee Member of the Placer Repertory Theater. A million thanks to all who voted me Placer Herald's Best of the Best 2024 Local Artist.




 - Art must have a taut, sturdy wire; highest peak of the wire should be at least 2-3 inches from the top of the frame; no sawtooth hangers will be accepted.
 - Original art only, prints allowed for photography only.
 - No repeats - art previously shown at the Rocklin Library will not be accepted.
 - Each piece should be labeled on the back with title and artist name.
- Artists are allowed to bring a printed bio and printed labels (without prices) if desired. A printed price sheet can be left at the front desk of the library.
